

The Narrator walks on stage as they walk off stage – Goldi in the direction of Red, and wolf in the opposite.

Narrator: Another thing about story telling is that the teller of the story writes what they HEARD the characters say – and what they HEARD is not necessarily what was SAID. A good example is Mr. Wolf’s son, Brad. He has been labeled “The Big BAD Wolf” because someone misheard his name, well, he did have a hard time with his “R’s” when he was younger so you can’t always blame the storyteller – anyway, Brad isn’t really BAD but he is blamed for a lot of things because of the missed “R” in his name. But, let’s get back to the scheme with the pigs...

SCENE FOUR: Wolf’s Emporium; outside wolf’s house

Wolf is dressed in a contractors disguise. He is standing under a sign that says “Brad’s Building Emporium” and is mid conversation with pig 2.

Pig 2: So you are SURE that these sticks are the best thing to build a sturdy house with?

Wolf: The very best we have!

Pig 2: Wouldn’t brick or stone be better?

Wolf: No, no, no. In this forest we get a lot of... of... acid rain. Yes, and everyone knows that acid rain eats through brick and stone... BUT, since these sticks are (quote signs) “all natural” they don’t react to acid rain. As a matter of fact, just a few minutes ago I sold a bunch of this straw to a pig who looked a lot like you.

Pig 2: That was probably my brother. Why didn’t he buy the sticks?

Wolf: He was just a little stingy with his cash. These sticks are going to cost you a little more, but you will be able to win with these.

Pig 2: Win? What do you mean?

Wolf: (looking worried that he spilled the beans) Win? I didn't mean to say that. I just meant... um, you will be (quote signs) "safer". Yes, you will be able to be safe with these.

Pig 2: Hmm. Well, if you say this is the best thing... (he pays the wolf and hauls the sticks away).

Narrator: Like I said before, Brad isn't a BAD wolf – but please note that I never said he was an angel either. Speaking of people who are not angels, Red has been at her grandmother's house for a while, but she is not being very helpful...

SCENE FIVE: Grandma's house

Grandmother: Red, could you take that wood glue to the Bear's house on your way home? Mama Bear needs it to fix Baby Bear's chair. I guess he can't even sit on it anymore or it will break.
